Read ALL cutting instructions CAREFULLY!!!! These instructions are for the ENTIRE quilt. Measure twice, cut once! Be sure to label all of your pieces after you cut them - so that you can easily find them when you need them each week! WOF = Width of fabric.





BLOCK ASSEMBLY

Step 1: Take a G square and two M triangles. Find the center of your triangle by folding it in half and finger pressing. Line up the center of your M triangle and G square. Sew an M triangle to the top and one to the bottom of your G square. Press. Do not trim off the excess points of your M triangles, you want the overage so that you won't lose your points later on.


Take your two renaming M triangles and follow the same steps, as above to sew M triangles to the left and right of your G square. Press.


Trim to 4 5/8" x 4 5/8".





- **Step 2:** Find the center of your B triangles and line them up with the center of your block (See
- Step 1). Sew a B triangle to two of the opposite sides. Press. Do not trim off the excess of your
- B triangles.
 - Take your two remaining B triangles and follow
- the same steps as above to sew B triangles to
- the remaining sides your block.
- Trim to 6 1/2" x 6 1/2".







BLOCK ASSEMBLY


Step 1: Sew E, D and O squares into rows as pictured below:



Step 2: Sew rows together. You will want to find the center of your first O square and center it with the row below. Notice you have a bit of overage on all the white squares. You need the overage! Continue sewing rows together as pictured below.



Step 3: Rotate your block and trim block to 6 1/2" x 6 1/2". Try and trim 1/4" away from your E squares, so that you don't lose your points!



BLOCK ASSEMBLY

Step 1: Draw a guideline from corner to corner on the wrong side of all K squares. Place a K square along one end of an H rectangle, right sides together, and stitch along previously marked guideline (the dotted line in the diagram). With a rotary cutter and ruler, trim excess fabric, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance, and press K fabric out. Repeat on the other end of the H rectangle to complete the flying geese unit. **Make 8 flying geese.**





BLOCK ASSEMBLY


Step 1: Take an F square and two I triangles. Find the center of your triangle by folding it in half and finger pressing. Line up the center of your I triangle and F square. Sew an I triangle to the top and one to the bottom of your F square. Press. Do not trim off the excess points of your I triangles, you want the overage so that you won't lose your points later on.

Take your two remaining I triangles and follow the same steps, as above to sew I triangles to the left and right of your F square. Press.

Trim to 6 1/2" x 6 1/2".



- Step 2: Draw a guideline from corner to corner
- on the wrong sides of all N squares. Place an N square and a B square right sides together.
- Stitch a 1/4" on either side of marked guideline.
- With a rotary cutter and ruler, cut on your guideline. This method will yield 2 HST units.
- Trim HST units to 3 ½" x 3 ½" square.



- Step 3: Draw a guideline from corner to corner on the wrong side of all A squares. Place an A
- square along one end of a J rectangle, right sides
- together, and stitch along previously marked guideline (the dotted line in the diagram). With a
- rotary cutter and ruler, trim excess fabric, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance, and press A fabric out.
- Repeat on the other end of the J rectangle to
- complete the flying geese unit.
- Make 16 flying geese units.






Step 4: Sew L squares to left and right side of flying geese units.



Step 5: Sew an L square to the left side of a flying geese unit, and a HST to the right side.



Step 7: Sew a flying geese unit the left and right side of your center square. Press.




Step 4: Sew Economy block between two flying geese/granny square units. Press.




Step 5: Sew rows together to form your quilt top.
